Session Formats and Topics

Session Formats*

(New!) Next Level Conversations

Table-top discussions in 30 minute blocks, repeated 3-4 times, to allow participants to rotate and learn about a variety of topics. Proposals should be framed as conversations with presenters acting as hosts. These conversations are intended to allow participants to learn about cutting edge solutions and ideas. Presenters will guide conversations, seeking to further the understanding for all table attendees. With no more than 10 people at a table, these conversations are intended to be a highly direct way of conveying information and gathering feedback from participants.

Dialogue and Discussion

An hour-long breakout session that focuses on tangible knowledge and skills for sustainability leaders and teams. The best sessions are those that are highly interactive and facilitate peer-to-peer learning.

Workshops

Three-hour sessions that focus on tangible knowledge and skills. The expanded time frame allows participants the opportunity to dive deeper into a particular topic of interest. Workshops must include an interactive component and facilitate peer-to-peer learning. Note that workshops will be held on Sunday afternoon, preceding the welcome reception.

Reviews
